

PUBLIC NOTICE
IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER
Monitoring Requirements Not Met

Hill City is required by Minnesota Rules, Chapter 4720 to test water sample(s) for Lead and Copper. This required sampling was not done for the monitoring period beginning June 1, 2017 and ending September 30, 2017.

Because we did not monitor or failed to monitor completely during the compliance period, we did not know what levels of lead and copper were present in your drinking water, and we are unable to tell you whether your health was at risk during that time.

[Samples taken since then show that all results met acceptable limits.]

What does this mean to me?

This is not an emergency. **You do not need to use an alternative source of water at this time.**

If other people, such as tenants, residents, patients, students, or employees, receive water from you, it is important that you provide this notice to them by posting it in a conspicuous location or by direct hand or mail delivery.

The Minnesota Department of Health requires 10 samples to be done during the above timeframe. 5 samples were submitted and the results met acceptable limits.
